### **Inclusion Is Diversity**



In addition to Quilts Around Oakland, Ora has displayed quilts locally and nationally, most recently at the 13th Annual African American Fiber Art Exhibition in North Charleston, South Carolina. She now has a solo show locally.

Starting in October and running till January 2020, Ora's show will be at the Albany Community Center Foyer, 1249 Marin Avenue, Albany CA. The three-month display kicks off with an Opening Reception on Sunday, October 13, 2019, from 4-6 PM.

The show will have multiple quilts on the theme of "Inclusion Is Diversity." The quilt below, Cynthia Rose, is inspired by Prince's song "Coffee and Starfish" about a very special little girl.
