



## Easy Quarter Triangle Pattern – Ernestine (Ernie) Tril

I thought this would be an easy quilt to make for worthy cause using quarter triangles. I watched a uTube video that used a similar method and I changed it up for this easy pattern. There was no pattern; it was just following along so I used the size that I thought would be good for an easy quilt. This is not your typical way of making a quarter triangles, but it is a quick and easy pattern. Best of all it is easy.

This makes a quick baby quilt. What you need:

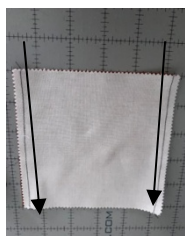
- 5x5 squares – a light and a contrast fabric – I used (20) 5” squares of both
- Borders – my first borders were 2”(light fabric in picture) - second border was 4” for sides & 2 ½ for 2<sup>nd</sup> top & bottom border – you can use whatever size border you like

I cut a leftover piece of fabric into 5” squares (you can use a leftover charm pack or choice of fabric). I then added 5” squares from a leftover charm pack for the light fabric. Using (2) 5x5 fabrics the block finished at a 6 ½” (I made 20 blocks).

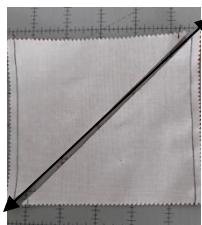
### Instruction:

- Take any 5” square and pair up with a lighter square (or darker, your choice) – place your two squares RST (no need for marking)
- Sew ¼” along the two sides
- Cut apart diagonally and press – **PRESS** not iron – this is a bias cut and will stretch
- Place the two half sq triangles RST on opposite sides and sew together
- Press open – cut your dog ears – this is one block – Finished block 6 ½”

You can make as many blocks as you choose for any size quilt. I made 20 blocks – 4 across and 5 down to make this quilt. I then added a couple of borders to measure 36 x 36 for my worthy cause quilt. This goes together quickly. I have examples below to follow (I like pictures too).



(2) 5x5 RST – sew 2 sides



Cut in half diagonally



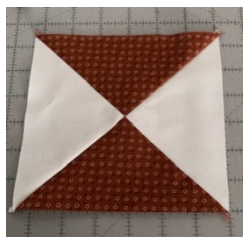
Press open



Opposite sides



Place RST - Sew



Open - Finished Block
